



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# CUT ALONG THE DOTTED LINE



## 1- MUSEO ETNOLÓGICO DE HORCAJUELO DE LA SIERRA. HORCAJUELO DE LA SIERRA

The museum, located in a hundred-year-old building, captures the traditional domestic spaces of Madrid's mountain range. The first floor conserves the living room, the kitchen and the two bedrooms; the top floor, that was used for storage, now exhibits an interesting collection of traditional costumes. There's also a collection of articles related to the area's rural economy.

## 2- CASTILLO-PALACIO DE LOS MENDOZA. MANZANARES EL REAL

Fortress-palace built in the fifteenth century following the isabelline gothic style. The main building, with three floors, has ten rooms to visit, such as the "zaguán" (hallway between the main door and a secondary one on old houses), the bedchamber and the chapel, recreating the style of the fifteenth century. The fortress-palace also exhibits an interesting collection of tapestries, paintings, suits of armor and furniture from the sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. It also includes an Interpretation Center with a permanent exhibition and an audiovisual collection.

## 3- MUSEO SOROLLA. MADRID

House built to serve as home for the Valencian painter Joaquín Sorolla (1863-1923) and for his family. Edified between 1910 and 1911, coinciding with the peak of his career. Conserves a splendid sample of his work, which shares space with collections of jewelry, glass, ceramics, etc., mostly donated by his widow, Clotilde, promoter, in turn, of the museum. The numerous photographs of the house taken during his lifetime have helped preserve its original character, with its easels, paints and the like. Worth mentioning is the garden, Mediterranean-inspired (mixture of Italian and Andalusian) designed by Sorolla himself, that makes one forget the noisy city that extends across the wall.

## 4- FUNDACIÓN FERNANDO DE CASTRO. MADRID

Building erected between 1891 and 1893 as headquarters for the Association for the Education of Women, founded by Fernando de Castro. It conserves its initial stylistic values, from its architectural layout to the various spaces and rooms that comprise it.

All its assets account for the trajectory of the Institution, library and archive. Currently, it continues to carry out its intense educational and research activity.

## 5- MUSEO NACIONAL DEL ROMANTICISMO. MADRID

Museum-house founded in 1924 by the Marquis of Vega-Inclán, located in a late-eighteenth century palace. The permanent exhibition offers the public a multidisciplinary interpretation of what the Romantic period represented in Spain by means of a visit that combines the thematic aspects (History, Art, Literature, Theater, Religion, the feminine domain, the male domain, etc.) with an approach to the life and customs of that period by recreating environments through the articles exhibited.

## 6- MUSEO CERRALBO. MADRID

The Cerralbo Palace, now Museum of the same name, was built between 1884 and 1892 in classic historicist style which is also seen in the garden. The Museum exhibits the collections gathered by Don Enrique de Aguilera y Gamboa, 17th Marquis of Cerralbo, and by his family. Paintings, furniture, clocks, porcelain, sketches, lamps, sculptures, weapons and armor, textiles, books, coins and archaeological objects are distributed throughout the different rooms where the daily and social life of its first residents took place. In addition, the Museum Cerralbo is one of the few examples in Madrid showing the original decorative atmosphere of an aristocratic residence carefully restored in the first decade of the 21st century.

## 7- FUNDACIÓN ANTONIO MAURA. MADRID

Stately home from the end of the nineteenth century property of the Marchioness of Manzanedo and bought by Antonio Maura in 1898. It preserves documentary, bibliographic, newspaper, cartographic and graphic collections, as well as personal belongings and original furniture from the politician's time. The Foundation's aim is to promote Maura's political figure and his historical-political context, as well as the study of History.

## 8- CASA MUSEO LOPE DE VEGA. MADRID

Located in the historic quarter of Madrid, in the Barrio de las Letras (Madrid's literary quarter), the Lope de Vega Museum-house is located in the building where the writer lived his last 25 years. The recreation of environments, whose objective is to help the visitors evoke the presence of Lope, shows the daily life of the "Siglo de Oro" (Golden Age) and offers an insight into its private life. During the tour you can see an interesting collection of art, furniture, belongings and bibliographic editions related to the writer and his time.

## 9- MUSEO CASA NATAL DE CERVANTES. ALCALÁ DE HENARES

It's located in the place where once stood the family home of Miguel de Cervantes Saavedra (1547-1616) and where the writer spent his early years. This museum shows the lifestyle of a wealthy Castilian family in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries through the recreation of public and private spaces. The tour of the rooms shows the customs, tastes and daily chores of its residents. It also exhibits an important library with editions of Cervantes' works from all times and in every language.

## 10- CASA MUSEO ANDRÉS TORREJÓN. MÓSTOLES

Small house, dated from 1800, dedicated to the works of Andrés Torrejón, mayor of Móstoles during the revolt against the French. It conserves furniture from that period, as well as farming implements and other articles displayed in the patio. Rooms such as his study, the sitting room, the bedroom, the kitchen and the stables can be visited. The Museum aims to preserve the memory of Andrés Torrejón and the historic events of the 2nd of May, 1808.

## 11- MUSEO CASA Y ESCUELA RURAL - HOMENAJE A LOS MAESTROS. TIELMES

School-home with garden, built in the nineteenth century. The building, comprised of two floors, has been restored keeping its original structure. The environment has been carefully recreated with great detail with the help of a great variety of donated and lent objects. The ground floor includes the kitchen, the dining room, and the classroom, with benches, blackboard, map, books and other teaching implements from that period. The upper floor displays the rooms belonging to the teacher and his family, which were inhabited until 1945. Of particular interest, in the outer walls, are the pictorial decorations of military themes, dated between 1840 and 1860.
